To this day, Atlanta still represents the quintessential city of the “New South” after the Civil War. Proud of their city, residents of Atlanta continue to be “boosters” supporting its current status as a first-class urban center and securing its future as a vibrant and forward-thinking city into the next century.

### 1 MINUTE

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**Martin Luther King Jr. National Historical Site**  
450 Auburn Ave. N.E. • 404-331-5190

The site where the civil rights leader lived and is buried. See where he grew up and preached, or take an educational tour of his birth home. Eight statues of men and women represent the Freedom March, too.

**Atlanta Cyclorama**  
800 Cherokee Ave. S.E. • 404-658-7625

The Cyclorama is a theater that rotates around a mural of the 1864 Battle of Atlanta, which is the largest oil painting in the world. Look for a moment, or get a quick history lesson listening to the accompanying story. There’s also a museum hosting Civil War memorabilia and artifacts.

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**World of Coca-Cola**

It’s everything you’ve ever wanted to know about one of America’s most beloved sodas. Memorabilia takes you back to the 1930s, plus you can see how the soda is bottled. Stick your cup under the “fountain of the future” for a fun surprise.

Journey into the heart of CNN Worldwide and get an up-close look at global news in the making. Inside CNN Atlanta is a 55-minute guided walking tour offering guests exclusive, behind-the-scenes views of the CNN studios and an exciting glimpse of newsgathering and broadcasting in action.

**High Museum of Art**

Named “one of the 10 best works of American architecture,” this sleek modern building houses the city’s finest collection of classic and contemporary art. Its atrium soars to four levels, where you can experience 19th-century paintings, European sculpture and authentic African relics.

### 1 HOUR (CON’T)

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**Atlanta Botanical Garden**

This natural oasis boasts 30 acres of cultivated plants, woodlands and gardens, perfect for finding a little solitude. The Fuqua Conservatory is the focal point, displaying foliage in tropical and desert environments, including rare or endangered plants. Also, the Japanese Garden is small and designed for meditation.

**Georgia Aquarium**  
225 Baker St. • 404-581-4000

The majestic glass and steel prow of the Georgia Aquarium beckons explorers to discover the 100,000 creatures inside. Check out the whale sharks, Asian otter and stunning Tropical Diver exhibit, and visit the “4-D” theater, where you’ll not only see jellyfish float by in 3-D, you’ll also feel their tentacles brush your face.

### 1 DAY

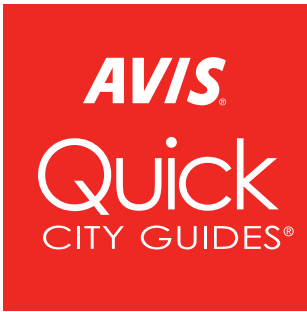
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**Château Elan Winery & Resort**

This retreat is styled like a French château and set on over 3,000 acres, and you can spend the day touring its 200-acre vineyard and winemaking facility to see the process from grape to bottle. Gourmet eateries like Versailles Restaurant and Café Élan round out the experience.

An hour outside Atlanta, Athens is a college town par excellence, and the cultural crucible that launched bands like the B-52’s and REM. ### GOURMET DINING

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#### Bacchanalia

This elegant lounge has pale yellow walls and lots of high windows. The prix-fixe menu includes steak tartare and foie gras terrine, plus braised red snapper and wood-grilled beef tenderloin. Reservations may take up to a month in advance.

#### Pano's and Paul's

An Atlanta landmark for more than 20 years, this elegant establishment offers up American-Continental dishes to customers waiting in luxurious velvet seats. The cuisine is just as elaborate, with Italian bronzino and their signature fried lobster tails.

#### Aria

Aria has won rave reviews from everyone from *Bon Appetit* to *Esquire*. The decor is sexy, sleek and modern, and the cuisine features an array of American traditions inspired by seasonal produce, meats and seafood. Expect slow-cooked meats, like the zinfandel-braised beef short ribs, and light and elegantly simple dishes, like the seared rare ahi tuna or oak-grilled Springer Mountain chicken.

#### Rathbun's Restaurant

Sleek post-industrial decor provides the backdrop for Rathbun's innovative New American fare, heralded by *Gourmet*, *Esquire* and *Zagat*. Expect seafood, steaks and more with unexpected twists, like the sambal-tossed crispy calamari or the veal chop with sweet corn and gouda cheese fondue. The outdoor patio welcomes walk-ins, but call ahead to land a table inside.

#### Ritz-Carlton Dining Room

This 5-star fusion of French, Mediterranean and Asian cuisines offers starters like cocoa bean soup with oyster tempura or foie gras with mission figs and port reduction. Entrées include citrus-cured cod and little neck clams with fennel broth or veal loin with wilted spinach, coconut cream and hazelnut oil-scented jus. The wine list boasts vintages from around the globe, and the décor is as sumptuous and elegant as the food.
