Approximately 25 million people visit Orlando—more than any other place in the entire “vacation” state of Florida. The growth of this world-famous resort town continues to be felt, happily, along with still-preserved and attractive areas of residential districts, replete with recreational parks and beautiful lakes.

1 MINUTE

Lake Eola Park Fountain
Rosalind Ave. & Robinson St. • 407-246-2827

At the center of Lake Eola, in the center of Orlando’s business district, sits its popular floating fountain that glistens in the day and comes alight at night. Relax and enjoy the view under the Asian gazebo, or circle the lake on the mile-long wooden sidewalk.

Take a minute to savor the shade in this peaceful oasis away from the clamor of the theme parks and downtown. Once a watering hole for cattle, now the park is a quiet, lush beauty year-round.

1 HOUR

Orange Blossom Balloons

Get your bearings high above Orlando with an hour-long, dynamic hot-air balloon flight. Lift-off is early (after 6 a.m.), but you can expect a full breakfast buffet on the ground to round out your time in the sky. Call for exact meeting place.

Ripley’s Believe It or Not Odditorium

The Orlando area is famous for its many sinkholes—tilting about 10° to its side, the museum appears to be sinking into one of them. After you’re greeted by Ripley’s “ghost,” you’ll find such bizarre exhibits as a 3/4-scale 1907 Rolls Royce made with matchsticks, historical torture devices and a two-headed kitten.

A few minutes away from downtown Orlando is the world’s largest collection of Tiffany glass, including a stunning stained glass chapel built in 1893.

Altamonte Mall

Need a shopping fix? Located just north of Orlando, the Altamonte Mall boasts 160 stores, like Macy’s, White House Black Market, Banana Republic and more, along with 15 restaurants and 18 movie screens.

Orlando Science Center

Here’s where to go for hands-on science fun. This modern science museum offers interactive exhibits, an IMAX theater and a planetarium. Check out the Body Zone, where you’ll wear 3-D glasses and take a truly fantastic voyage through the circulatory system, check out the fossils in DinoDigs Animal Kingdom or cry “Eureka!” as you play scientist in Dr. Dare’s Laboratory.

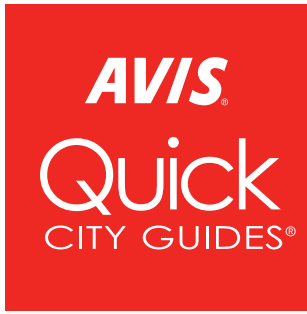
1 DAY

Kennedy Space Center
State Road 405 • 321-449-4444

Head 45 minutes east to the Cape to get up close to the heart of our nation’s space program. Climb into replicas in the Rocket Garden, experience a simulated Apollo 8 mission, see space in 3-D on a 5-story IMAX screen and take a driving tour of the shuttle launch area.

Silver Springs
S.R. 40 (exit 352 East off I-75 or exit 268 West off I-95)

Located 90 miles north of Orlando, this a 350-acre nature theme park surrounds the headwaters of the beautiful Silver River, the world’s largest artesian spring formation. Take a glass-bottom boat ride to see fish, turtles and alligators in water that’s up to 80 feet deep and 99.8% pure. Afterward, you can see a show or explore the habitats of Florida’s alligators, endangered bears and panthers.
